What are essential oils?

Essential oils are the volatile, aromatic liquids that can be distilled from plants. Each essential oil is comprised of many different constituents that work together synergistically to give the oil its unique properties. Many essential oils have been used for healing and pleasure for thousands of years.

How to use essential oils:

Massage:

Mix 5-10 drops of essential oil with 1 oz. of a pure vegetable oil and massage on the skin.

Inhalation:

Place 1-3 drops of essential oil on a tissue, cotton ball, or strip of fabric. Hold this close to your face and inhale, or attach it to a ceiling fan or air vent.

Room Spray:

Place 10-15 drops of the essential oil with 1 oz. water in a small spray bottle. Shake well and spray in room as desired.

Bath:

Mix 3-6 drops of essential oil with 1/2 oz. unscented shower gel or 1/4 cup Epsom salts and add to water while filling.
